1. OFFICER OF THE DAY 1100 hrs 16 June 1944 to 1100 hrs 17 June 1944
1ST LT JAMES M. ADAMS, JR O-572052 327th Bomb Sq (H)
2. LIBERTY RUN FOR ENLISTED MEN: 32nd Station Compl Sq will furnish one officer.
3. ATTENTION ALL PERSONNEL: (BONDS) Following information received from War Department, is quoted for your information and necessary action. Quote, "Effective immediately a \$10.00 denomination United States Savings Bonds, Series E, to be known as the GI Bond, is authorized for sale only to Military Personnel, both Enlisted and Commissioned, at issue price \$7.50.
Stock of new denomination bond will not be available until August 1944. Therefore these bonds will be sold only under Class B Allotment system as Plan 12 and will not be sold for cash or through PTA until authorized. In preparing WDAGO forms 29-6, or 30-7 for new denomination bond, words "Plan 12, \$7.50" will be clearly written in space immediately above plan Nine.
Existing class B allotment regulations will be strictly observed in sale of new bonds, particularly in regard to discontinuance of instalment plans only upon an anniversary date and use of only one allotment plan per subscriber at any one time. Personnel should be advised that bonds will be issued and delivered as soon as new bond stock is available, but bonds will be dated back to effective month of purchase and pay deduction as shown on WDAGO form 29-6 forwarded to Army War Bond Officer.
This new denomination bond available to Military Personnel makes continuance of instalment plans for buying of bonds unnecessary but "Bond A month Plans" will continue. Therefor, effective immediately, new class B Allotments for purchase of war savings bonds under instalment plans: Namely Plan Two for \$6.25, Plan four for \$12.50 and Plan six for \$25.00 per month will not be initiated. Any instalment allotments already transmitted with effective date 1 July or later will not be processed by Army War Bond Office and pay deductions will not be made therefore.
Instalment allotments now in effect or already transmitted will be discontinued automatically with issue of June, July or August depending on bond anniversary date. As such discontinuances will be automatic, no discontinuance of WDAGO forms 30-7 will be processed by field and no notification of discontinuance of such allotments will be processed by Army War Bond Office.
These instructions which was previously directed. All commanding Officers are directed to advise disbursing officers, Personnel Officers and all Personnel of new denomination bond and of Automatic discontinuance of Class B Allotment instalment plans. Commanding Officers should conduct vigorous campaign with their Commands to obtain from all personnel, whose instalment allotments will be discontinued by this directive or have not heretofore participated in war Bond program, A new Class B allotment under "Bond A Month Plans", namely three, five, seven, eight, nine, ten, eleven or twelve.

4. ATTENTION ALL UNIT COMMANDERS: Following TWX recd from Hq CBS SOS' ETOUSA is quoted for your information and guidance:
"Effective 15 June all enlisted personnel guilty of uniform violations will be tried by appropriate courts martial on the spot. Officers will be immediately returned to organizations and full report rendered. PD.

COMMON UNIFORM VIOLATIONS INCLUDE

1. Service coats, Field Jackets, or Jackets, Field, UK unbuttoned or carried Pd Field Jackets authorized only for alerted units when service coats not available.
2. Caps worn improperly. Ground forces wearing caps without Grommet. Air Force wearing caps with crown pulled back over head resembling beret enlisted men wearing caps with officers braid.
3. Personnel unshaven or wearing dirty uniform.
4. Truck drivers and details arriving with mixed uniforms such as fatigue trousers with Field jacket or garrison cap PD If remaining overnight cma service uniform must be available if men are to go out on streets Pd
5. Failure to wear ties or having shirt collars unbuttoned Pd This applies particularly to personnel authorized to wear field jackets.


Above directive applies to personnel visiting London area.

5. ATTENTION ALL UNIT COMMANDERS: In compliance with instructions contained in G.O 56, ETOUSA, 29 May 1944, all organizations having personnel with black ties, will have them turned in and brought to the Station QM with a requisition for khaki ties to replace the black ties. All requisitions must be submitted by 19 June 1944..
