4. WEARING OF UNAUTHORIZED INSIGNIA: The following letter received from Hq USSAF, dtd 7 Aug 44, for strict compliance:
"It has come to the attention of this Headquarters that there have been numerous instances where personnel have been wearing either embroidered or metallic insignia denoting membership in the "Caterpiller Club" or "Gold Fish Club" as part of their uniform.
It is desired that the necessary action be taken to prevent this practice as the wearing of these insignia is not authorized by Army Regulations.

5. ATTENTION ALL UNIT COMMANDERS: Following teletype received from Hq 1st Bomb Div, dated 15 Aug 44, and will be brought to the attention of all members of their command:
"UNIFORM AND MILITARY COURTESY BY US MILITARY PERSONNEL IN THIS AREA IS NOT UP TO REQUIRED STANDARDS AND MUST BE CORRECTED IMMEDIATELY.
MILITARY POLICE ARE BEING INSTRUCTED TO APPREHEND ALL VIOLATORS AND IN CASES WHERE STATIONS HAVE AN EXCESSIVE NUMBER OF INCIDENTS TOWNS MAY BE PLACED OFF LIMITS TO THE STATIONS CONCERNED."
