1. OFFICER OF THE DAY 1100 hrs 17 June 1944 to 1100 hrs 18 June 1944
1ST LT JAMES M. ADAMS, JR O-572052 327th Bomb Sq (H)
2. LIBERTY RUN FOR ENLISTED MEN: 32nd Station Compl Sq will furnish one officer.
3. PREPARATION OF MORNING REPORT: Attention is invited to Ltr, Hq VIII AF, file 704 (MRU), Subject: "Non-Battle Casualty Report" on Morning Report. This will be strictly complied with.
4. ATTENTION ALL UNIT COMMANDERS AND ADJUTANTS: By order of Colonel Reid the program of "Army Talks" will be initiated on this Station immediately. The purpose and aims, methods and aids will be discussed at a compulsory meeting of all Unit Adjutants Monday, 19 June 1944, 1300 hours at the Post Theatre.
5. ATTENTION RED CROSS CLUB AND ALL MESS HALLS: Effective Saturday, 17 June 1944, the individual Mess Halls and Red Cross Club will be responsible for cleansing of their grease traps each morning. Skimmers and cans will be provided by Base Utilities. Grease containers will be picked up by Base Utilities daily.
6. UNAUTHORIZED DISASSEMBLY OF SMALL ARMS: Within the last few days a number of small arms have been turned in to the Ordnance Armory for repair and replacement of parts missing due to unauthorized disassembly. It cannot be too strongly emphasized that due to the present demand for parts, by the ground forces, the supply of spare parts is very short.

In order to clarify the difference between authorized and unauthorized disassembly, the following table will serve as a guide. The provisions of the table will be adhered to strictly and any deviation therefrom will result in a Statement of Charges.

Carbine, U.S. cal. .30, M-1 may be field stripped only. Field stripping consists of:

- a. Removing the front band.
- b. Removing the mechanism from the stock.
- c. Disassembling the trigger mechanism from the receiver.
- d. Removing the operating spring and guide.
- e. Removing the operating slide and bolt.
- f. The trigger mechanism and gas piston groups will not be taken down under any circumstances. Nor will the bolt be disassembled.

Pistol, U.S. cal. .45, M1911-A1 may be field stripped only. Field stripping consists of:

- a. Removal of recoil spring and plug.
- b. Removal of barrel bushing.
- c. Removal of slide stop and slide with barrel and spring guide.
- d. Removal of firing pinstop, firing pin and extractor.
- e. No other disassembly is permitted.

Daily Bulletin #120, Hq AAF Station 109, 16 June 1944 (Cont'd)

Gun, Submachine, Thompson, M1928A1, M1, M1A1 may be field stripped only. Field stripping consists of:

- a. Separation of frame from receiver and removal of the butt stock on the M1928A1.
- b. Removal of the recoil spring, recoil spring guide and buffer pilot and buffer.
- c. Removal of the bolt, bolt handle, actuator, breech lock, breech oiler, hammer pin, hammer, firing pin and firing pin spring. The extractor may be removed if extreme care is taken.
- d. The trigger mechanism will NOT be disassembled, nor will the ejector, compensator, front sight, rear sight or grip mount be removed.

Rifle, U.S. cal. .30 M1903-03A1-03A3 may be disassembled with the following exceptions:

- a. The rear sight will not be removed or disassembled.
- b. The front sight will not be disassembled.
- c. The bolt sleeve will not be disassembled.
- d. The trigger mechanism will not be disassembled.
- e. The stock will not be removed.

Rifle, U.S. cal. .30 M1 may be disassembled with the following exceptions:


- a. The trigger mechanism will not be disassembled.
- b. The rear sight will not be disassembled.
- c. The bolt will not be disassembled.
