2. LIBERTY RUN FOR ENLISTED MEN: 446th Sub-Depot will supply one officer.
3. INSPECTION OF WEAPONS: Effective immediately unannounced inspections of weapons will be made by the Ordnance Armory Section. These will be made to determine the condition of the weapons while in storage. Any necessary repairs will be made on the spot if possible. The points to be especially checked will be bores, stocks, leather equipment and trigger mechanisms.
4. ATTENTION ALL PERSONNEL: The venereal disease incidence at this Station is extremely high and has undergone an outrageous increase during the past two (2) weeks. Many of the contacts are evacuees from London who are living in this district at present. Everyone is again warned that any "pick-up" must be assumed to be infected. Any person is exercising gross negligence and utter disregard of health who:
 1. Becomes too intoxicated to use proper precaution.
 2. Fails to use both mechanical and chemical prophylaxis.
 3. Fails to obtain full name and address and ways to relocate any contacts.
