2. LIBERTY RUN FOR ENLISTED MEN: 326th Bomb Sq (H), will furnish one Officer.

3. ATTENTION ALL OFFICERS: Officers in charge of individual trucks of the Liberty Run are required to furnish the driver with their name, rank, and organization when leaving the station and also on the return trip.  
Pamphlet AG 451/2, Hq, ETOUSA, Change #18, dated 7 June 1944, states that this type of transport will travel not in excess of 30 miles per hour (during blackout hours--20 mph). The officer permitting his driver to exceed this rate of speed does so at his sole responsibility. The rate of speed of the lead truck or trucks immediately preceding a given truck in a motor column does not govern the rate of travel of the truck or trucks following.  
TO REPEAT--To safely and properly operate a liberty run truck becomes, therefore, the sole responsibility of the officer in charge of that truck, and his responsibility only!
