3. ATTENTION ALL PERSONNEL: A sudden marked increase has occurred in the number of cases of sore throats at this Station; these are definitely contagious. Possible ways of transmission are from person to person, insufficiently sterilized eating and drinking utensils, and food or drink that has been contaminated by a mild case or a carrier. The establishments on the Base serving food and drink have been contacted to enforce the use of care in preparing and serving food and to keep adequate hot water for washing eating utensils. Everyone is asked to cover their mouth when coughing or sneezing, to avoid crowds and poorly ventilated rooms when unnecessary, and to make certain that all eating and drinking utensils are adequately clean before use.
