2. LIBERTY RUN FOR ENLISTED MEN: 327th Bomb Sq (H) will furnish one officer.
3. UNAUTHORIZED PURCHASES AT SALES STORES BY OFFICERS FOR ENLISTED MEN: The following letter received from Headquarters, Eighth Air Force, dated 28 June 1944:

"Reports from WBS, CZ, ETOUSA, APO 515, indicate that officers continue to make purchases of Officer clothing from Sales Stores and mobile units for the benefit of enlisted men.

This practice is in direct violation of the regulations governing the allowances of clothing for officers, (Adm Cir 81, Hq, SOS, ETOUSA, 3 November 1943) and will be curtailed immediately."

4. WEARING OF INTERMEDIATE FLYING CLOTHING (A-9 AND B-10) BY GROUND CREWMEN: The following teletype received from 1st Bomb Division dated 2 July 1944:

"8AFSC ADVISES GROUND CREWMEN HAVE BEEN ISSUED AND ARE WEARING INTERMEDIATE FLYING CLOTHING (A-9 AND B-10). THIS PRACTICE MUST BE DISCONTINUED AS A-9 AND B-10 CLOTHING WILL BE NEEDED FOR USE WITH NEW TYPE F-3 ELEC HEATED CLOTHING WHICH WILL EVENTUALLY BE IN GENERAL USE. EFFORT IS BEING MADE TO HAVE B-3 JACKETS AUTHORIZED FOR ISSUE IN LIEU OF D-1 MECHANICS JACKETS.
