"FOLLOWING MESSAGE RECEIVED SAF D-69414 QUOTE TODAY THE GREATEST EFFECTIVE STRENGTH IN THE HISTORY OF THE EIGHTH AIR FORCE WAS REACHED; AN OVERALL EFFECTIVENESS OF APPROXIMATELY SEVENTY-FIVE PERCENT OF ALL CREWS AND AIRPLANES ASSIGNED. PLEASE EXTEND MY CONGRATULATIONS TO ALL MEMBERS YOUR COMMANDS FOR THEIR UNTIRING EFFORT IN ACHIEVING THIS IMPRESSIVE STRENGTH. DCOLITTLE UNQUOTE.
