4. ATTENTION ALL PERSONNEL: The venereal disease rate at this Station
has again jumped to a very high figure. There were six (6) new cases
reported during the week of 8-15 April inclusive. Two (2) of these being
syphilis and four (4) gonorrhea. Cases were reported from the following
organizations - 1205th QM Co, 325th Bomb Sq, 326th Bomb Sq, 327th Bomb Sq,
and 446th Sub-Depot.

The 1205th QM Co is hereby presented with the V.D. Pennant for the
week of 18-25 April inclusive - this organization having the highest rate
per 1000 per annum.

Most of the cases occur as a result of utter negligence in the usage
of preventative measures and an absolute lack of discretion in selection
of contacts from which the exposures have occurred. Everyone owes to
himself, his family and the war effort, more than is being manifested by
this present situation. Let everyone do his part to bring about an improve-
ment in this condition immediately.
