2. LIBERTY RUN FOR ENLISTED MEN: 32nd Sta Compl Sq furnish one Officer.
3. MONTHLY SUGAR REPORT: During April no aircraft dispatched by the 326th Bomb Squadron aborted from a Combat Mission. This record is unique in the recent operational history of the Group and reflects the highest credit upon the skill and diligence of all Maintenance and Combat personnel of the Squadron.  
With a substantial lead on all other organizations, the 327th Bomb Squadron placed the most bombers over Axis targets, The Fortress maintained by T/Sgt H.L. Padgett and crew of this Squadron had the finest individual aircraft record in the Group for April, participating successfully in all but two of the month's raids.  
The Legion of Merit has been awarded to M/Sgt J. E. Dye of the 327th Bomb Squadron. Aircraft for which he has been responsible as Crew Chief have achieved an operational record of exceptional length and perfection.
4. CONFIDENTIAL AND SECRET PAPER FOR SALVAGE: All "Confidential" and "Secret" paper for salvage will be turned in to the Station Quartermaster by 3 May 1944.
5. R E P E A T - RED CROSS LOANS: Effective 1 May 1944, no further pass, leave, or furlough loans will be made unless the pass, leave, or furlough is granted because of a definite emergency.
