1. OFFICER OF THE DAY 1100 hrs 23 May 1944 to 1100 hrs 24 May 1944
CAPT JAMES F. FURLOW C-164354 327th Bomb Sq (H)
2. LIBERTY RUN FOR ENLISTED MAN: 327th Bomb Sq (H), will furnish one Officer.
3. AIR CORPS ENGINEERING CCS: The following teletype received from 1st Bomb Division dated 20 May 1944:

"FOLLOWING MESSAGE RECEIVED FROM 8TH AF FORWARDED FOR YOUR INFORMATION QUOTE: THE DEPARTMENT ADVISES PLAN AUTHORIZING RESUME OF PARS TO USA FOR AIR CORPS ENGINEERING CCS HAS BEEN DISCONTINUED. APPLICATIONS SUBMITTED BY MEMBERS OF YOUR COMMAND ARE BEING RETURNED DOCLITTLE UNQUOTE."
4. V-MAIL AIR MAIL SERVICE: The following Circular No. 51 received from Headquarters, AFMUSA, dated 13 May 1944:

1. Effective 15 May 1944, V-Mail letters mailed by the armed forces overseas prepaid at the air mail rate (6¢) will receive preferential handling over ordinary V-Mail throughout the V-Mail channels and will be given air mail service in the US after processing at the domestic station of destination. The postage will be affixed in the space indicated on the red, folding type V-Mail forms, and in the case of the flat V-Mail letter form, it will be affixed in the lower left corner of the reverse of the form.

2. V-Mail letters are separated, according to destination, into geographical divisions of the US and microfilmed for dispatch to the V-Mail station located at New York, Chicago, or San Francisco, as the case may be. The respective states served by these stations are:

- a. New York. Connecticut, Delaware, District of Columbia, Florida, Georgia, Maine, Maryland, Massachusetts, New Hampshire, New Jersey, New York, North Carolina, Pennsylvania, Rhode Island, South Carolina, Vermont, Virginia and West Virginia.
- b. Chicago. Alabama, Arkansas, Illinois, Indiana, Iowa, Kansas, Kentucky, Louisiana, Michigan, Minnesota, Mississippi, Missouri, Nebraska, North Dakota, Ohio, Oklahoma, South Dakota, Tennessee, Texas, and Wisconsin.
- c. San Francisco. Arizona, California, Colorado, Idaho, Montana, Nevada, New Mexico, Oregon, Utah, Washington and Wyoming.

3. Unit Commanders will bring the provisions hereof to the attention of all members of their commands to the end that all military personnel may be advised of the advantages of the V-Mail air mail service.
