2. LIBERTY RUN FOR ENLISTED MEN: 446th Sub-Depot will furnish one officer.

3. ATTENTION ALL DRIVERS: It has been noted that vehicles have been using the driveway near Hangar Number 2 for a short-cut to the main road or to the perimeter track. Henceforth, only vehicles transporting materials to Hangar Number 2 will use that driveway.

4. COMMENDATION: The following teletype received from 1st Bomb Division dated 18 November 1944:

"FOL TTX RECEIVED FR 8AF: 'D-61136. ON NOVEMBER 16 THE EIGHTH AIR FORCE PERFORMED ONE OF ITS MOST OUTSTANDING OPERATIONS. THE FORCE TOOK OFF UNDER EXTREMELY ADVERSE BASE WEATHER CONDITIONS AND SUCCESSFULLY ATTACKED TARGETS ON THE IMMEDIATE FRONT OF OUR GROUND TROOPS ALMOST EXCLUSIVELY BY INSTRUMENT TECHNIQUE WITH VERY GOOD RESULTS. GROUND COMMANDERS WERE HIGHLY PLEASED AND REPORT ALL BOMBS ON OR NEAR THE TARGETS, WITH NO INJURIES TO FRIENDLY TROOPS. IT WAS A DIFFICULT TASK WELL DONE AND I COMMEND YOU FOR THE CAPABLE AND EFFICIENT MANNER IN WHICH IT WAS CONDUCTED. DOOLITTLE'  
MY APPRECIATION TO AIR AND GROUND PERSONNEL FOR AN EXACTING JOB WELL DONE
