3. BAN ON SALE OF CIGARETTES TO NON-COMBAT PERSONNEL: The following teletype received from 1st Bomb Division dated 21 November 1944:
"1 BD N-987-Y FOLLOWING TFM QUOTED FOR INFORMATION AND COMPLIANCE QUOTE PER TELETYPE OKX-15126 FROM COMMANDING GENERAL HQ COM Z ETO, THE SALE OF CIGARETTES WILL BE DISCONTINUED IMMEDIATELY BY ALL EXCHANGES EXCEPT THOSE OPERATED AT AIR FORCE COMBAT STATIONS, HOSPITALS, GROUND FORCE REPLACEMENT SYSTEM, AND REST AREAS. AIR FORCE STATIONS, HOSPITALS, GROUND FORCE REPLACEMENT SYSTEMS, AND REST AREA EXCHANGES WILL LIMIT SALES TO AIR FORCE COMBAT PERSONNEL, HOSPITALIZED PATIENTS, GROUND FORCE REPLACEMENTS, AND MILITARY PERSONNEL IN REST AREAS. REQUEST COMPLIANCE BY ALL POST EXCHANGES IN YOUR COMMAND IMMEDIATELY SIGNED WILTSHIRE UNQUOTE. COMBAT PERSONNEL REFERRED TO INCLUDES ONLY PERSONNEL CURRENTLY ON ACTIVE COMBAT STATUS.
