Mildel: Report on 12 anning and Execution of Operations of Mission 23 March 1944, herbern (eight (5) miles No. of Marm.)

TO : Commandia, Officer, 92nd Bombardment Group (H) AAF, AFO #557.

1. Comment on Manning and Execution.

- 40th Combat ing by Capt. Frasse at 225 hours 22 farch 1944. The order called for seven (7) B-17's to be loaded with 12 x 500 CP bombs each with 1/10 second maximum 147-Al IB's.
- b. The Field Order was received from Headquarters lst Homo Wing by Captain Frasse at 0112 hours 25 March 1944. Flight plans and details of the Mission were completed, briefing being set for 0400 hours and take-off time
 - 2. General Carrative.

E. 92nd Bomb Group (High Group Loth Joubat sing)

(1) Take-off was accomplished by twenty-one (21) B-17's from the 97mm bomb Group beginning at 0550 hours. The assembly for this group was over Foddington on the AOth Combat ling Burcher at 14,000 lest. See Diagram Wir. The 92md Bomb Group departed Foddington at 0512 hours and rendezvoused as high group with the 40th Combat ling.

(2) The 92nd Bomb Group followed the route over ingland in Combat ing formation according to the flight plan. The inglish Coast val departed at 0045 nours, 17,000 feet and the enemy coast was entered at 0900 hours, 21,000 feet.

(3) The rrimary Target I.F. was reached twenty-nine (29) minutes early due to wind changes. The Frimary Target was found to be obscured by 10/10 cloud cover and the group continued on toward the Becondary Target. Shortly after the I.P. severe enemy fighters at acks were encountered and four aircraft from the low squadron were shot down before or after the target. The 92nd Lord Broup nomined on the smoke trails of previous groups. Bombs were dropped at 1117 hours, 21,000 feet on a magnetic heading of 305 degrees (Diagram 95%)

(4) The enemy coast was crossed at 1211 hours and a rescent was made. The inglish coast was crossed at 1242 hours and the lead aircraft reached the base at 1317 hours.

b. 92nd nomb Group Low Squadron. (Low Jidn. Low Comp. 3p. 46th OF)
(1) Seven (7) aircraft from the 92nd Lomb Froup took-off beginning
et 0509 hours to assemble on the 46th Jombat ling number at 10,000 feet as

3. .ircraft fot Attacking.

a. Of the twenty-eight (28) B-17's from the 92nd Lomb Group that tookoff, twenty-six (26) aircraft attacked the target.

b. The two (2) aircraft that failed to attack were shot down by enemy fight rs before the target.

4. Lost Aircraft.

a. Four (4) aircraft 42-31868, 42-31455, 42-31552 and 42-31231 were shot down before or after the target by enemy fighters. It is not known which of the four aircraft were at shot down before or after bombs away.

b. Aircraft 42-38104. This A/C was last seen to be healing for France after leaving the formation at the enemy coast on the return route. It was reported that the tail of this aircraft was badly shot up by enemy fighters over the target.
