HISTORY OF HEDICAL DEPARTMENT, 92nd BONS GROUP (H)
December 1945.

SUBJECT: Current Medical History of 92md Remb Group (H) for December 1945.

20 : 6.0. 40th Bomb Wing A. APO 633, E.S. Army.

In accordance with the Provisions of circular letter (314.7) Headquarters 40th Bomb Wing dated 6 Depember 1945 and 40th Bomb Wing instruction letter No. 80-1 dated 1 Dec 1945 the following current Medical History of the 92nd Bomb Group is submitted.

1. Operationer

a. Personnal this station received Typhus immunizations on the 3rd, 5th, 5th December. A few who failed to receive the immunization at this time were called in from time to time, during the month and immunized.

b. The locality was subjected to a severe cold wind storm (Mistral) on the 6th, 7th, 5th of December, during which a wind velocity of 75 MPE and a temperature of 23 degrees was recorded. The wind and cold caused freezing of all water sources, and subjected the men to mederately severe exposure, since they were housed in inadequately heated mon-winterized, tropical prefabricated buts. The personal hygiene and morals of the troops was greedy and adversely affected due to the lack of water and poor housing. A special sanitary report covering existing conditions was submitted with similar condemnation reports by the Ground Rescutive, the Fire Marshal and others in an attempt to secure winterising materials for the housing and on allweather water facility.

c. On the leth of December, a spot physical check revealed that a large percentage (12 - 15 %) of the troops were embetic. After considerable administrative difficulties enough bense - benseate was secured from the medical depot to treat the necessary number of troops. Ambbile (steem) disinfector was secured from the Delta Base Section on the 13th, for sterilization of blankets and disting. Methyl bromide bags and gas for sterilization of flying equipment and leather goods was also obtained. The personnel effect unit received a "Stripderm" Scabies inspection in conjunction with the reutine monthly physical inspection on the 17th, 18th, 19th, 20th and 21st. All personnel found to be scabetic were given a four day treatment with bensebanasets. In conjunction with the treatment sterilization of all contaminated clothing, blankets and bodding was mandatary and accomplished considerable sterilization of equipment of non scabetic treeps, was accomplished at the same time. This program was essentially completed on the 27th of December. Some stragglers many from the station during the program were passing thru a similar exercise at the close of the menth. The program was successful in its mission.

d. Staging of approximately 300 Officers and 28 for return to the 21, commenced on the 27th of December, and was still in operation at the close of the menth. The dispensary was active in completeling influence, small per, typins and triple typheid vaccinations during this period.

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e. Routine, mess, latrine, shower and barracks inspections were assemblished at least once each week during the menth. The 126th Bomb Squadron mess hall was given particular attention with resultant improvement.

f. Water chlorination testing of all unit water supplies is a daily procedure. The specimens for water analysis were submitted on the 27 Dec to the 227th Gea. Hespital.

g. The routine cooks and food hundlers inspections were accepplished from time to time during the month.

2. Praining.

a. Training posters for scabins control were devised and placed in conspicous places slong side the V.D. posters, and on all kulletin beards, on Dec 13th.

b. Hedical training of Enlisted Hen was informal in nature, and was performed generally through the month. Formal training in the form of proscribed lectures at specific times was not deemed worthwhile in view a large percentage were eligible for redeployment in the very hear future

3. Administration,

a. Charges in Key personnel.

1. Major F.P. Crabtree, station curgoon, was redeployed to the

4. Capt. Imadore R. Goldbarg D.C. was on the T.DT to the Z of I for a period of 30 days, effective 13 Dec 1945.


5. Sgt. James A. Howden, was proposed to staff sergeant effective 15 Dec 1945 and MDS changed from 409 to 673, administrative specialist. Sgt Howden was made NCO in charge of Station Sick Quarters.

6. Sgt. Alex A. Stivala; MOS changed from 409 to 859 Pharmacy technician on 15 Dec 1945.

7. Gesporal Henry Unck was promoted to Sergeant on 15th Dec

8. Cerperal John Hohnson; MOS changed from 590 to 657 medical

Improvement of the dispensary, to the extent of building cabinets, and drain beards was accomplished on the 21st. The few materials for the construction of an eye lame for 64 physicals were most difficult to some and were finally scrowaged by the C.O. of the 92nd Beard Group on the 27th. He new medical MM personnel were assigned. Morals of the medics as well as the entire group is very superior considering the environment and lack of a mission for the group. The medical personnel have been anally to personnels in Athletics one to the weather and lack of a side free of wilders, for miles around, and within at least 6 feet of the curriage of the ground.
