EVENTS COURTING DURING PREBRUARY 1945
AND INVOLVING THE MEDICAL DEPARTMENT OF 92ND BOXES GROUP

During the south infantry physical examinations were given to \$5 non-combattant Unlisted Wen at this Station. 67 were remained in accordance with the lowering of physical standard for vision. 44 Unlisted Wen were transferred from this Station on 27 February to fill the second quota of infantry reinforcements.

On 7 February 1945, Captain ONEN T. DURLACHAN, D.C., went to the Sighth AF Fest Home at Phyllis Court, AAF Station 194 and spent a weeks tour of duty as Dental Officer of that Station. Captain CLETUS T. KEARDET, M.C., Surgeon, 407th Boab Squairon went to Eighth AF Rest Home, Chrington Manor, ALF Station 498 and spent a weeks tour of duty as Medical Officer of that Station. On 16 Pebruary 1945 Captain JOSEPH C. DONOHUE, D.C., went to the Mighth AF Rest Home, Stanbridge Maria, AAF Station. On 21 February 1945 Captain HARRY A. LUSE, M.C., went to the Eighth Air Force Rest Home, Stanbridge Maria, AAF Station 503, to spend a warks tour of duty as Medical Officer of that Station. On 22 February Captain ALSOY, H. GLYASON, M.C., went to the Mighth Air Bost Home, Furuelcom House, AAF Station 563, to spend a weeks tour of duty as Medical Officer of that Station. On 27 February 1945 Captain ALSOY, H. CLYASON, M.C., attouded a Venereal Disease Control secting at the Surgeon's Office, Hq Eighth Air Force.

Special medical training was given to six (6) new combat crews on 6 Peb. 1945 and to Peur (4) new crews on 4 Peb. 1945.

On 19 Tebruary 1945, it. John E. Desgan, 325th Book Squadron and erew abandoned their ship near Homeybourne, Morcestershire, England, atte start of an operational mission when the No. 4 engine caught fire. Three (3) numbers of the crew received minor injuries but were not hospitalized.

On 25 February 1945, Sgt. Bobbie F. Morrie, Engineer, 325th Bomb Squadron received a fracture of the mandible, which was incurred in the traffic pattern prior to landing following an operational mission. He was cheeking the landing gear and the lever kicked back and hit Soldier's jaw. Fatient was treated as Station Sick Quarters and transferred to the 49th Station Hospital.

On 27 February 1945, Sgt. Sertel A. Bertelson, Ingineer, 326th Book Squadron was killed at landing following an operational mission. While removing guns the top turnet turned and caught the soldier between the turnet and side of ship crushing his head and neck and causing death by asphyziation.
